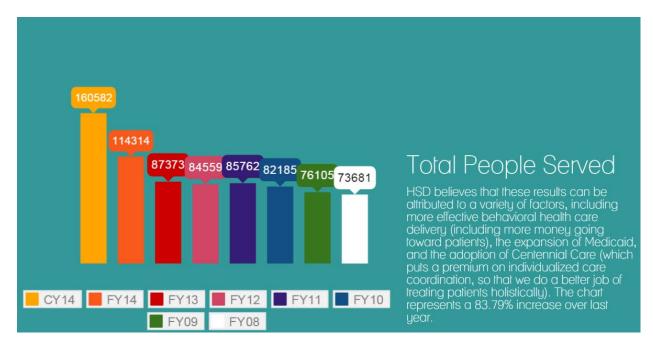

NM Behavioral Health – Increase in Consumers Served

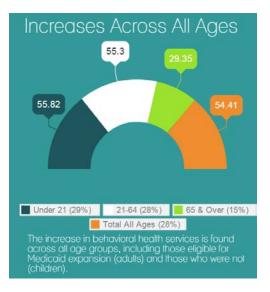
- For a second year in a row, we are serving more people than ever before
 - We have seen an increase of 83.79% over last year (CY14 over FY13)
- This is a significant increase over the previous year
 - We saw a 30.8% increase the previous year (FY14 over FY13)



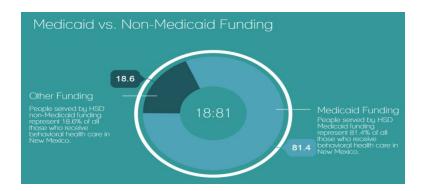
- Medicaid is providing a more effective behavioral health delivery system
- Governor Martinez, in choosing to expand Medicaid, has helped more people in New Mexico gain health care coverage, many for the first time ever
- In addition, Governor Martinez oversaw reform of our Medicaid program by implementing Centennial Care, which requires more patient-centered care
 - A key to the behavioral health success has been the care coordination system contained in Centennial Care – consumers are able to be more quickly connected with the services they most need with their care being tracked throughout the system
- We have seen an increase in all demographics being served, including those who were not eligible under Medicaid expansion, as well as those being paid for through Medicaid and non-Medicaid funds



An increase across all age groups has been seen as well – 55.82% for under 21; 55.3% for 21-64; and 15% for 65 & over



 Those being served with Medicaid funding represent 81.4% of those receiving behavioral health services, while those being served by non-Medicaid funding represent 18.6% of those receiving behavioral health services



- Total consumers served in CY14 is 160,582, compared to 87,373 people served in 2013
- For the first time ever, we are releasing county-by-county data
 - This will allow us to more effectively track what is happening at the county level
 - In addition, we will also be able to more effectively deliver care and make adjustments as needed by tracking data at the county level
 - o This is made possible by the reforms that were implemented through Centennial Care

- For example, before we even count non-Medicaid utilization (i.e., just using Medicaid managed care and FFS), we see:
- o 58,864 consumers accessed services in Bernalillo County
- o 18,184 ... in Dona Ana County
- o 10,188 ... in Santa Fe County
- o 5,883 ... in San Juan
